A TIME FOR TRANSFORMATION

The anticipation of a Xmas (please do not be offended by this word — it's neither an incorrect spelling nor an attempt to remove Jesus as the centre of Christmas; it's really quite the opposite) that's Merry; the excitement of a New Year that's Happy. What a wonderful time the end of the year is!

The dates come and go, and with them, the merriness and happiness fades. It was nice while it lasted. But everything goes back to being un-merry and unhappy again; it feels like nothing has changed. It goes back to being *Ordinary*.

So as we begin 2018, quickly exiting the buzz of Xmas and New Year celebrations and entering into Ordinary Time, may we intentionally live out Christ in the year ahead. May we be transformed into Christ-likeness.

With that, I wish you a (belated by the time you read this) Merry Xmas and a Happy New Year! And of course, a Transformative Ordinary Time!

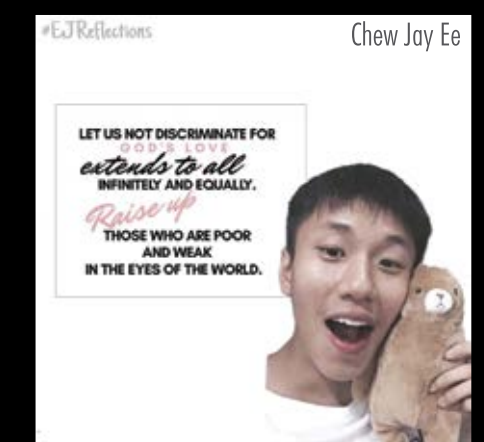

VISITING THE PROMISED LAND

Sea of Galilee

Departing on 24th November, our trip to Istanbul, Jordan and Israel was exhilarating, eventful and challenging.

We had mixed experiences with our guides and some of us fell ill along the way. Thankfully, we managed to remain focused on God as our ultimate guide to learn the history and experience the sights and sounds of Jordan and the Promised Land.

We walked down the Mount of Olives and the Garden of Gethsemane. We navigated the cobbled alleys of the Old City culminating in the Church of Holy Sepulchre, believed to be the site of Golgotha. The Dome of the Rock, a mosque with an impressive golden dome and blue mosaic walls built over the site of the first and second Temple and where it is believed that Abraham attempted to sacrifice Isaac, gave a glimpse into the land's complicated history.

Golan Heights was bitterly cold, buffeted by chilly winds as evening approached. Overlooking neighbouring Syria, we began to grasp the significance of its position and the ongoing tussle between Israel and her neighbours. Two members were baptised and another ten remembered their baptism through immersion in the Jordan River. Three couples also renewed their vows at Cana where Jesus performed his first miracle at a wedding.

Those who braved the trek up to the hilltop fortress of Machaerus in Jordan were rewarded with panoramic views but reminded of the sacrifice of John the Baptist who was beheaded there. The view atop Mount Carmel

was also breathtaking as we watched the sunset and recalled Elijah's fiery challenge against the Prophets of Baal.

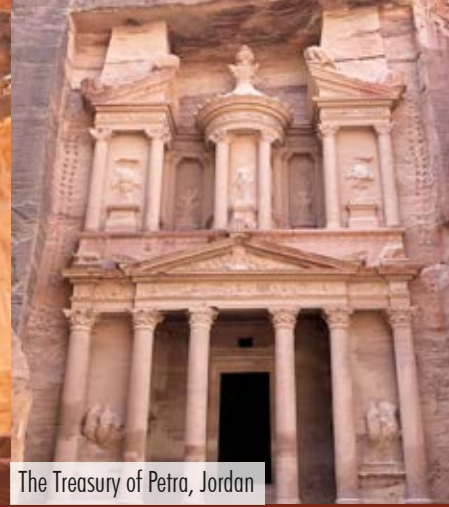
Over the 14 days, we visited more than 25 churches and chapels. Icons marked every site of religious significance. Atop Mount Nebo, I was similarly drawn to a towering cross entwined by a serpent. I recalled the sermon by Pastor Reuben on the Nehushtan and made a mental note to take a picture before I left. I was disappointed to see that another group of visitors was taking their time posing for photos, oblivious to the many other visitors waiting near the foot of the cross. I grew impatient as the tour guide had given strict instructions, "Ten minutes!". A member of our group urged the group taking photos to hurry. Feeling offended, one of the men who had gotten down from the cross approached wagging his forefinger menacingly at our group member telling him to stop speaking. For a tense moment, I thought that this would escalate to an altercation. Thankfully, our group member responded calmly, shaking his head in disapproval. At that moment, I was jolted out of my complacency and wondered why taking that picture was so important to me. Was the Nehushtan effect similarly taking hold of me?

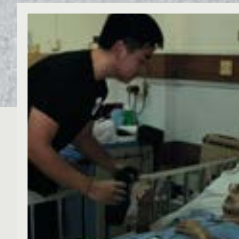
PRAYER AND PRAISE

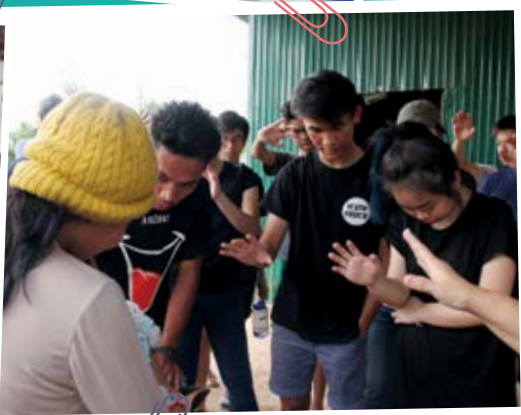
