




# PASTOR'S MESSAGE - ENCOUNTER TO LOVE ONE MORE

#### The State of Methodist Churches in the United Kingdom

Some years back, our current Trinity Annual Conference President, Reverend (Rev) Stanley Chua, shared that he went to the United Kingdom about 15 years ago and visited several Methodist Churches there. During his visit, he was saddened to see that these once-vibrant churches were physically dilapidated, and most had less than 50 members each.

#### Having the Form of Religion but without the Power

Rev Stanley's observations remind me of something that John Wesley (the founder of Methodism) said near the end of his life:

*"I am not afraid that the people called* Methodists should ever cease to exist ... But I am afraid lest they should only exist as a dead sect, having the form of religion without the power."

More importantly, Rev Stanley observed that the programmes and activities of most of the churches did not contain any form of outreach. Although their current state cannot be directly or fully attributed to the lack of outreach, there surely is some correlation.

Will our local churches similarly end up only existing, having the form of religion but without the power? The pertinent question then is this: How do we allow God to demonstrate His power to and through us?

I think that one of the most profound ways is to allow God to do what He has promised, that is, to build His Church (Matthew 16:18) through us. As we submit to Him, we will begin to see His power at work.



#### Church Theme for the Year

Therefore, our church theme this year is One More. Combine this with our church vision, Encounter to Love, we want to **Encounter to Love One More**. As we encounter God's power at work in our lives to love One More, the Lord builds His church in our midst.

Who are the One More? They are the loved ones, friends, colleagues, and neighbours in **our Spheres of Influence, that is, our Relations (our immediate and extended family members), our Vocations (where we work), our Recreations (where we play) and our Locations (where we stay).** If we pray and ask God to show us the One More to whom He wants to display His love and power, I believe that He will lead us to the person.

Through the leading of the Holy Spirit, we will then **love**, **bless**, and make a difference to their lives, by **Developing Friendships** with them, **Discovering their Stories** and **Discerning the Next Steps to take**.

We pray that by doing all these, the Lord will manifest His love and power in and through us, so that His church will be built up, and many will come to the saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### O For A Thousand Tongues to Sing (UMH 57)

Will not it be wonderful, if we all do our part to allow God to work His power in and through us, that at the end of this year, another Thousand Tongues will sing of our great Redeemer, praising the glory of our God and King, and the triumph of His grace!

# CHRISTMAS EVE AND \* **CHRISTMAS DAY SERVICES**

As in previous years, Toa Payoh Methodist Church held services on both Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to commemorate and celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. We were glad that, in addition to our online services, we could hold in-person services, two on Christmas Eve and three on Christmas Day. Especially heartening was how worshippers pulled together to make the third Christmas Day in-person service possible, after seeing the overwhelming number of registrations for the initial two services. Below are some highlights that we captured on both days.





2020 was a challenging year for Singapore. Numerous activities, economic and social, had to be halted or restricted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Religious activities were not spared. Services at Toa Payoh Methodist Church (TPMC) had to be moved online as tighter measures were introduced by the government to curb the spread of COVID-19. Thankfully, the situation gradually improved, and in-person services resumed, albeit with a limited capacity and safe distancing measures. TPMC was thus able to organise a Watchnight Service on 31 December.

The service started at 11pm with a recorded video of musical worship leading the praise and worship of God in our hearts (as live singing was still not allowed). This was followed by a sermon from Reverend Ming Feong Ching who reminded us of our calling by God to be a priesthood and holy nation (1 Pet 2:9). In trying times, this was a fitting reminder that God had called us out of darkness into His light and we have access to Him.

After the sermon, TPMC renewed her covenant with God, reaffirming her commitment to God in both good and bad times. When the clock struck twelve, 2021 was ushered in with the resounding ringing of handbells. Reverend Reuben Ng then led TPMC's first Holy Communion of the year with that being his final act as Pastor-in-charge, before moving to his new appointment at Faith Methodist Church.

Many activities for TPMC's jubilee year had to be cancelled or curtailed due to the pandemic. Nonetheless, we are grateful to God for helping us to adapt and seeing us through the year. God has also enabled us to continue spreading His love and serving the community through a blood donation drive and various avenues of giving. Let us then continue to strengthen our relationship with God and spread His Word and blessings to those who have yet to hear or experience them.









# INTERPRETE

Sometimes in life it seems that we are faced with a hopeless situation where, like Peter, there is no way out. Yet, the power of a church united in prayer brings deliverance, changing hopelessness to hope.

When God's people come together in prayer, extraordinary things will take place. We came together in the Corporate Prayer service to begin the year. Let us press on and continue to come together in prayer on Sundays, in our Connect Groups, in our families, and see the chains fall off, and the people delivered from darkness to light.

# LIGHT OF CHRISTMAS 2020


Since 2015, Toa Payoh Methodist Church (TPMC) has organised the Light of Christmas (LOC) in the form of Christmas carnivals or markets. However, it was not possible to hold a live event in 2020 due to COVID-19. Nevertheless, this has not deterred us from sharing the Christmas joy with our neighbours. To do that, the LOC organising committee decided to give out Christmas packs to all households living in rental flats in Toa Payoh. Each Christmas pack came with four specially designed LOC masks, a batteryoperated lit-up star, an activity booklet and a box of colour pencils for children, Christmas memorabilia and snacks. The items were packed in a LOC tote bag imprinted with a beautiful background of the Toa Payoh estate.

About 450 TPMC worshippers stepped forward to pack and distribute the Christmas packs from 11 to 13 December 2020. From young children to seniors, it was a wonderful sight to see TPMC working together to bless the households. It was also very encouraging to know that many residents appreciated our efforts. In total, about 4,200 Christmas packs were distributed. Besides the Toa Payoh residents, packs were given to the children of Chen Su Lan Methodist Children's Home, Marymount Centre, PCF kindergartens in Toa Payoh and Toa Payoh Methodist Preschool. In conjunction with TPMC's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we had the privilege of President Halimah Yacob to give out the Christmas packs and vouchers to 30 students under the Toa Payoh Central Community Club Bursary Programme at our premises on 19 December 2020. The event was also graced by Defence Minister Dr Ng Eng Hen and Mr Saktiandi Supaat, both Members of Parliament for Bishan-Toa Payoh GRC, and Bishop Dr Gordon Wong.

Finally, let us not forget why we celebrate Christmas. The beautiful blue background, three wise men and Star of Bethlehem that lit up the church's façade in the evenings from 1 to 25 December 2020 reminds us of God's love for the world through the birth of Jesus Christ. Indeed, Christmas is a great opportunity for us to share God's love and blessings with the Toa Payoh community. We give thanks to God that we are still able to do so as a church during this challenging period.

# HOW TO REACH YOUR FAMILY FOR CHRIST:

#### **UNDERSTANDING THE ASIAN MINDSET**

As we embark on evangelism and outreach this year, the Discipleship & Nurture Ministry has planned various teaching and equipping sessions related to this commission that Jesus has given us.

The Chinese New Year is a period where we meet up with family members and presents one of many opportunities we have to engage and share Christ with them. However, we often use a "Westernised" approach of sharing the Gospel which does not necessarily consider the Asian culture. We also often lack an adequate understanding of the Asian mindset.

To address these issues, the Discipleship & Nurture Ministry organised "How to Reach Your Family for Christ: Understanding the Asian Mindset" on 28 January 2021. The teaching session helped participants understand the presuppositions, belief systems, mindsets, and traditions of Asians - their worldview - so that they can share the Gospel in the local context. The speaker Ms Chow Lili conveyed ideas of how we can be relevant and versatile, especially when sharing the Gospel with the elderly through casual conversations. Contextualization is the key for our communication of the Gospel to make sense to people in their cultural settings. Ms Chow also presented various scenarios from her experience.

For Asians, respect for elders and honouring family roots must be part of the process when presenting the Gospel. Most of all, we were reminded that sharing our faith is not a formula but a lifestyle.

*"I came from a non-Christian family"* background. I have been praying for the salvation of my loved ones. The teaching session equipped and prepared me to be always mindful, observant, and respectful when we create conversations with family members to share the Gospel.

If we are longing for our loved ones to find salvation, do not give up HOPE. By God's grace through faith in Christ Jesus, pray without ceasing and our Heavenly Father will soften a hardened heart for our families' salvation."
