
Terrarium Workshop

Relationships Unite!

n our Filipino Ministry (FM) we work with the slogan, 'relationships-unite; religion-divides'. This serves as a reminder as we reach out and minister to those who have yet to know God, hoping that through the FM we will be able to bring them into a relationship with Jesus Christ. This is how the

slogan came about. There are so many Christian denominations divided by different beliefs and doctrines that instead of uniting Christians to work together in strengthening the Church, it causes conflicts and division. Therefore, we focus less on establishing which doctrine or teaching is correct, and

more on building a strong foundation of faith through the simplicity of the gospel founded in God's love and a relationship with Jesus Christ.

In our commitment to reach out and minister to Filipinos primarily in the area of Toa Payoh, the FM has the following programmes in place:


- for those who are interested to learn to play an acoustic guitar. Open to all, lessons are conducted every first and third Sunday at 1.00pm. There is no fixed venue.

The trip to Israel from 21 November to 3 December 2015 with Toa Payoh Methodist Church was one of my best, most memorable travel trips. I had been putting off plans to visit the Holy Land for many years. Despite being new to the church, I felt that this year was the right time to visit the Holy Land, and so even though I knew just two persons in the entire group, I decided to just have faith in the Lord that everything would somehow work out... and sure enough, the Lord did not fail! For me, this trip was about 3Es:

Eye-opener

This trip was an eye-opener, not just about the awesome beauty of Israel, but also a great discovery of God anew. Rev Reuben Ng (TPMC Pastor-in-Charge), who accompanied us on the trip, made it a point to explain and teach about the heart of God in the context of Scripture at each venue we visited. For example, in Kursi (a Gentile region) he explained how Jesus chose to travel across the Sea of Galilee just to free a Gentile man from the legion of demons that were possessing him.



The visit to the Holocaust Museum was another eye-opener too. History puts the blame on the Nazis for the annihilation of the Jews. Yet upon closer investigation, believers would be put to shame with the realization that Christians actually had a hand in perpetuating the events in history, and how many chose to be silent when the evil was done – the wisdom of Scripture to "not judge lest we be judged!"

Experience

Miracles aren't just records in the pages of the Bible. God is always and still actively working and watching over us even in our day-to-day affairs.

The group had the best weather every day during the trip – the Hippodrome in Caesarea still had puddles of water from the heavy rain the week before we arrived but the weather was just perfect for us!

Our local guide also kept telling us how the situation in Jerusalem was volatile and that sites could be closed to tourists without warning. Having heard how stringent the checks were at the entry to Temple Mount, our group were thankful for gaining entry on the day of the visit. In fact, an incident happened minutes after we were in the Temple Mount and we thank God for His protection. The site closed very shortly after that, even though it was only around 9am then.

God's presence was strong during the entire trip. In both the Church of St Peter's Primacy and the Garden Tomb where we had Holy Communion, there

was an overwhelming sense of the strong love of God and the reminder of the extent of His love for each one of us! When the group had our time of worship during the Boat Ride on the Sea of Galilee and in the Church of All Nations (ie Gethsemane), I was especially touched by how the God of Majesty who created the beautiful sights before me would choose to tread the earth and leave His footprints as He mingled with fallen creatures like us - how a holy awesome God would choose to sit amongst the lowly and unworthy. Yet such is God's love - the teardrops He chose to weep for stiffnecked Jerusalem and the drops of blood He chose to shed in the Garden of Gethsemane for YOU and for ME! &


God, Self and Others.

I have found My Encounter Journal a very productive way of reading the Bible more. The way it has been structured appears simple at first glance, but after trying it out I've realised that it is actually much deeper and more intricate than it looks; in fact, it has been able to spur me towards more conversation with God than the Bible reading plan which I had been following. Also, because of its relative simplicity, it is something that can be done in addition to existing quiet time material. There's no excuse even if one is too busy, it is really as easy as R-O-A-D. There's beauty in its simplicity.

Using R-O-A-D, it provides guidance to a better and in-depth writing of my observations and thoughts and the application of the passage. Quiet time now is not only reading the particular passage but also dwelling on the message and spending more time having a conversation with God.

Synopsis:



Positive elements:
