

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

LOOKing **UP** seems to be an instinctive gesture for humans. A lady sits upon a park bench deep in thought, having to make a difficult decision, looks up. A man in desperate need for a solution as he faces an insurmountable, endof-the-road situation, looks up. Somehow, while scenarios may differ, the action remains similar, people look up whenever there's a need for further strength, wisdom, and hope.

The first of TPMC's Vision 2015 states the same - Look Up. We understand that this however is not an encouragement for us to engage in the physical act of looking up, thereby exhorting us TPMCians to walk around with our noses in the air.

Rather, it's a call to intentionally and with spiritual eyes look up to God our Almighty Creator. It's a reminder to constantly rely upon Him, to wait upon Him, to draw from Him, to be refreshed by Him and to walk in Him. It's to stress that without Him we are nothing as all things come from Him and He is everything. The wise and appropriate thing to do then, is to look up - to keep our eyes fixed and focused on Him because whatever we require is found in Him.

Perhaps that's why the Psalmist writes about looking at the right thing in Psalm 121:1–2 (NLT) llook up to the mountains—does my help come

from there? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth! The Psalmist is aware that it's not about looking up through physical eyes to see what sources of assistance or strength we can find, no matter how massive or majestic they may be. But it's about looking up through spiritual eyes at God who is our true help. After all, why look through physical eyes at created things for help, when we can look through spiritual eyes at the Creator who made heaven and earth?

Jesus exemplifies this for us. Before He fed a hungry multitude with a boy's lunch, Matthew 14:19 (NLT) tells us that Jesus took the food, looked up toward heaven and blessed the food. Everyone received more than enough.

Just before He was to be captured and tortured, John 17:1 (NLT) says that Jesus looked up to heaven, prayed and received the very help He needed - He was glorified that God the Father was glorified.

May we heed the words of the Psalmist, the actions of Jesus, and continue to Look Up.



COURAGEOUS (DVD movie)




THEO (DVD series)





It was a Friday evening. I was feeling tired. It had been a long day. I wanted to go home and rest more than anything. Going for Worship Night wasn't one of my top priorities. Sleep probably ranked somewhere higher... Nevertheless, in resigned obedience I went.

I stepped into the Main Sanctuary, and it felt unusual to be in the Main Sanctuary on a Friday evening. Yet, amid that sense of strangeness was a sense of restedness. A feeling of respite from the week's toils came upon me, an unexpected oasis. Resigned obedience yielded to curious anticipation. Shortly after, a video started playing, exhorting us to a time of worship. Contemporary worship anthems followed, taking their place alongside traditional choral exultations. Dancers stirred, complementing music with movement.

But Worship Night would be misplaced if it were simply a show of song and dance. In between worship sets, pastoral team members shared the reason for why we worship - He who was, who is, and who is to come. "He who was" was a reminder of His faithfulness and steadfastness, "He who is" spoke of His constant presence and perfect grace, "He who is to come" declared His promises on which our hopes are founded on. Faced with these truths, worshipping Him was the only appropriate response.

Jessica Leah Springer said "As John 4:23 says, it's time, as worshippers of God, to give him all we have. For when He is exalted, everything about me is decreased. So many times we stand in the way of really stepping into the secret place of worship with God. Just abandon tradition and the "expected" ways of praise and worship and get lost in the holy of holies with the sole intention of blessing the Father's heart."

When God is exalted, everything about us - our tiredness, fears, anxieties, frailties, pains, hurts is decreased. Worship Night is a reminder that when we intentionally seek to bless our Father's heart, it is simply delightful to get lost in His love.

I went to Worship Night tired, and left refreshed.

In our church's Vision 2015, Cell Group ministry is not under Look Up. So when I began to wonder whether the editorial team had made an honest mistake in requesting this write-up, a prompt from within quickly arrested further doubt: Do you not look up and depend on Me in Cell Group ministry?

Duly chastened, I began to reflect upon the Cell Group ministry since I arrived in early 2013. Indeed, we had made great strides since then, and really, this is a team effort from the pastors and leaders – especially the Cell Group Leaders, who are 'on the ground' to shepherd the flock. But even the pastors and leaders would agree with me that the sum of all our human efforts did not produce the fruit we now see. God was, and still is, at work – in His usual unseen way.

Over the two years, Cell Groups have begun focusing on spiritual growth and care of members, as well as following the sermon series and applying the Word into their daily lives. More authentic relationships and accountability structures are being formed within the Cell Groups, and many testimonies of deepened faiths abound as a result of Cell Group interactions. There is also a renewed interest in Cell Groups across the board, as church attendance continues to climb and We had about 540 persons in Cell Group about two years back, but now the number has gone up due to almost 100 newcomers – a testament to the increasing openness of our Cell Groups in welcoming newcomers into their midst. About five new Cell Groups were birthed, as leaders responded to the call to multiply and start new groups. Our Cell Groups are also meeting more regularly.

Truth be told, as leaders of the Cell Group ministry, we can only teach and encourage and pray; trusting God for the results. And how He has been faithful in the fruitfulness of ministry we now see! As we continue to busy ourselves over the demands of ministry, may we always remember to **Look Up** and expect His colabouring hands at work, alongside ours.

SERVE WITH A GRATEFUL HEART



Joseph Tay is a volunteer serving with the Christian Counselling Service (CCS). He has received various awards and recognition for his dedication and contribution to the community.

My volunteering journey began more than 20 years ago in 1991 as a Volunteer Aftercare Officer. It is a journey that I'll continue until the Lord calls me home.

The Basic Training Course with the Singapore Prison Service sets volunteers off to a good start as they will learn how to interact with inmates and get tips on what the volunteers can do to help ex-offenders reintegrate back into the society.

Serving with the Christian Counselling Service (CCS), I go into the prisons to conduct worship services for the inmates every Sunday. I will always try to give the inmates some words of encouragement at the end of every service because I want them to have hope and to plod on despite facing difficulties in life.

The work of a Prisons volunteer does not end when the inmate is released from prison. They actually need more help upon their release.

Ex-offenders often revert to their old ways because they are not able to find the means to support themselves. The sad reality is that some face rejection even by their own family. Many have little option but to seek comfort from the very people who got them onto the slippery road of crime. This is a vicious cycle and some of them will keep coming back to prisons. Never be discouraged when they do so. Such is life and it is not all a bed of roses. Be positive and have some faith that the inmates eventually will turn over a new leaf one day. I remember meeting a former drug addict who had lost all hope in himself because everyone rejected him after his release. He was so depressed that he wanted to end his life.

Upon learning his plight, some of the CCS colleagues and I spent a lot of time counselling him. We even managed to find him a job.

With the new job, he began to pick up the pieces and persevered through life. Today, he is gainfully employed, married with three children and even spend some of his free time counselling drug addicts in prisons.

I hope to see more volunteers coming forward to join us as there are many worthy causes but few helpers around.

When you do volunteer, do not be hasty and commit yourself to too many organisations at once as you might not be able to cope with the volunteer work and become disillusioned.

Serving with the Prisons' Ministry has been very satisfying and I want to continue until the Lord calls me home.
