 $oldsymbol{\mathsf{A}}$ sk any regular taxi driver who isn't GPS-reliant, or any resident in Toa Payoh, and they will tell you one of the two most recognisable church buildings in the neighbourhood is housed in a corner along Lorong 2. This is no surprise, as Toa Payoh Methodist Church has been part of Toa Payoh for almost half a century.

Just as a town built on a hill cannot be hidden, a community of believers in Christ cannot conceal itself from the public eye. Our calling is to be 100% salt and 100% light. Jesus uses these two metaphors to describe his Church and tell us how we ought to live in our society. He says,

You are the salt of the earth ... You are the light of the world ... Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father, which is in heaven (Matthew 5:13-14, 16).



1 Welfare

Although a simple gesture, this act made me feel comfortable and I believe this would have been the thought of others as well.



2 Small group discussions

Breaking into smaller groups allowed for more raw discussions on God among the participants, and a greater liberty to be open with their views as well. It offered a common place for those with a spark of interest in Christianity to gather and talk about their perspectives. I believe that this helped to create diversity in the conversations.



3 Facilitators

With their open hearts and listening ears, the facilitators were an important part of the discussion. Their honest sharing, wellthought questions and patience were ingredients to a fruitful discussion.



All in all, Alpha was a good starting point to get to know about Jesus, for those who have not yet believed, and for those who believe, a way to reignite and grow in our relationships with Christ and revisit the foundations of our faith.


