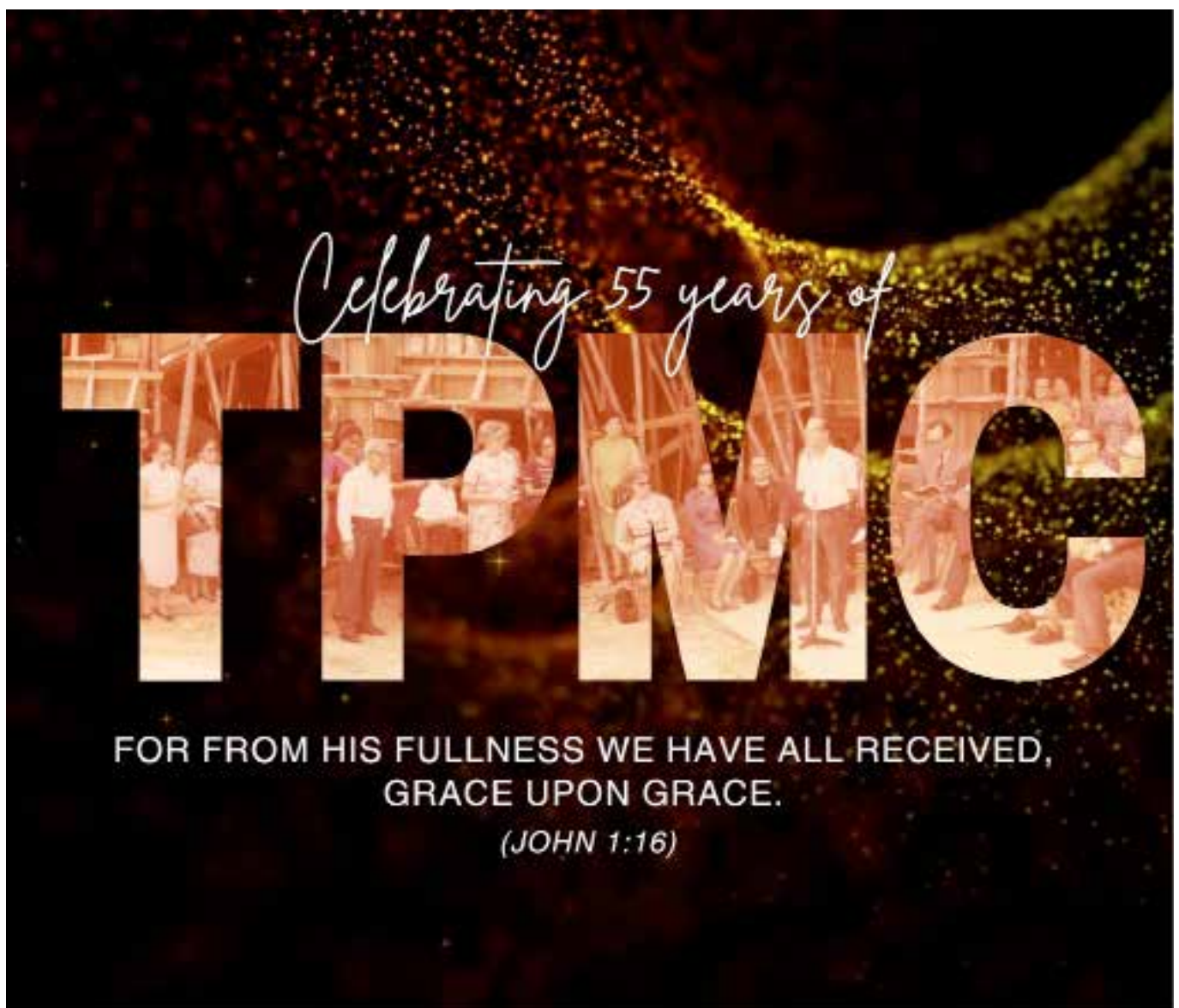

# Get to Know *Ms Janice Ong*

PASTORAL STAFF IN CHARGE  
OF CONNECT GROUPS



**Question:** Tell us a bit about yourself.

**Answer:** I come from a small family of four, and it was my late father who brought the whole family to Toa Payoh Methodist Church (TPMC) in 1981! I grew up in Sunday School and began serving the Lord there as a teenager. As a young adult, I served in different roles: Sunday School teacher, usher, choir member, worship leader, and prayer intercessor. After TPMC sponsored my studies at Trinity Theological College, I served as a pastoral staff member at TPMC upon graduation in 1999.

It has been an awesome adventure of faith since the Lord led me to step out of my comfort zone at TPMC, leaving behind 20 years of treasured friendships. Through it all, I have been greatly blessed as I experienced time and again God's loving, gracious and faithful hand in my life. He has deepened my inner walk with Him and grown my ability to serve Him in various churches and Christian ministries.

*And now, after 25 years, I am back at TPMC to serve the Lord! I can testify what Jeremiah 29:11 says about God—what He does and will do—is absolutely true!*

*“For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the LORD, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future”.*

**Q:** What were you doing prior to joining the church office?

**Answer:** I was a Secondary School teacher before I received God's call to serve Him in church ministry. Prior to joining as a pastoral staff (Connect Groups) in March 2025, I served as a School Chaplain in Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School, ministry staff member at Covenant Evangelical Free Church, and a pastoral team Member in Faith Methodist Church. I also had a short but meaningful stint with CareKids, the children's outreach programme run by Care Community Services Society for the MacPherson community.

**Q:** What excites you most about working here?

**Answer:** Firstly, God made the way for me to come back home to TPMC to serve! Secondly, the joy and privilege to be part of the pastoral team to shepherd God's flock here in intentional and authentic discipleship which includes disciple-making. It is my passion to see people grow in life and in their faith journey with the Lord. My prayer is for God to impact my life, so that I impact others, and those lives, in turn, can impact even more lives, making 2 Timothy 2:2 come alive!

Finally, I am really looking forward to re-connecting with those I knew 25 years ago and getting to know all the new faces.

# Remembering Our Beginnings as a Clinic in Toa Payoh: *Project Tribute*

This August, as Toa Payoh Methodist Church celebrated our **55th anniversary**, we remembered our humble beginnings as a free clinic in Toa Payoh. In line with **Nurse Appreciation Month**, we took the opportunity to thank and remember those who care for our community. Called Project Tribute, we blessed **650 healthcare workers** from **28 healthcare organisations**, with care packs.

Our worshippers worked together to make this project a success. **Befrienders** visited clinics, medical centres and nursing homes to deliver the gifts and express our gratitude. **Drivers** ensured timely deliveries, and **packers** worked behind the scenes to assemble each gift with care.

A special highlight was the involvement of our children and youth. Some **150 of them** penned

words of Scripture, hope, and heartfelt thanks in personalised cards (that were included in the care packs) to encourage the healthcare workers. In total, **more than 300 worshippers** participated in this community project, embodying our theme to “Love One More”.

The gifts were warmly received, and the project opened new doors to connect with a new group of stakeholders in the Toa Payoh community.

We thank God for the privilege of serving together as His people—sharing grace, building connections, and reminding our community that they are loved. As it is written, “from His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace” (John 1:16).





# SHARING GOD'S LOVE

OUTREACH AND SOCIAL CONCERNS'  
FIRST MOVIE SCREENING  
FOR THE COMMUNITY

The Outreach and Social Concerns (OSC) ministry of Toa Payoh Methodist Church (TPMC) is dedicated to sharing God's love and care with disadvantaged and underprivileged people, both within the church and in the wider community. To this end, OSC organised its first-ever movie screening on the afternoon of 28th June 2025.

In the weeks leading up to the event, OSC stewards and helpers visited the residents of Block 150, a block of rental flats near the church, to extend invitations to the event. Through the "Connect 150" programme, OSC regularly blesses these residents with gifts, and welcomes them to TPMC-organised events. Several residents accepted the invitation, joining a group that included recipients of TPMC's financial assistance, 28 students from the Beacon free tuition programme, and 20 Boys' Brigade cadets. In total, 108 people gathered to watch the animated science fiction adventure film, Elio, at Golden Village Bishan. The audience was also treated to popcorn and Coca-Cola to complete their movie experience.

Before the film began, Pastor Ming presented the TPMC Character Award, an initiative by OSC to recognise and support students from less privileged backgrounds. The award honours their dedication to regular school attendance and good conduct.

As the movie began, it was clear the audience was captivated and the joy in the cinema was palpable. However, one moment stood out as Madam Rubiah binte Asim tugged at the heartstrings of the OSC stewards and helpers from her wheelchair.

"This is my first time watching a movie in a cinema," she said. "I am so happy to be here, even before the movie started."

Her simple yet profound statement served as a powerful reminder of how we easily take daily experiences for granted. It also underscored the mission of OSC to continue sharing God's love with the less-privileged in our church and community.

# From *Doing* to *Being*

## MY SILENT ENCOUNTER RETREAT

I like to call this the “Silent -> Encounter” Retreat. I’ve found that it’s only when I embrace silence that I can better encounter the Lord. After the retreat, I felt refocused, renewed and refreshed. I was finally able to set aside all my “to-do” lists, concerns, and worries of this world, stepping away from work and ministry to focus solely on Him. My mind was renewed with a clearer understanding of what it means to live a life worthy of Him amidst the hustle and bustle of life. I also gained a refreshed perspective on my daily walk with Him and His role in my life.

The two-day, one-night retreat involved a lot of silence. There was no talking, no social media and no crafts, the last of which was especially hard for me as an introvert, since crochet is my therapy. Besides eating, sleeping, worshipping, and hearing the Word from the Spiritual Director, time was

spent completely alone. This solitude with the Lord allowed me to read and meditate on His Word, learning to listen and allowing Him to speak to me without distraction.

Being with God, focusing on Him through His Word, and simply *\*being\** rather than *\*doing\** was not an easy task. We love to talk, get involved, and constantly be in action. However, through this solitude, I am awakened to the fact that I have inadvertently replaced the worship of God and being in His presence, with the serving and doing of ministry. I have drifted away from dedicating intentional time to build my love and relationship with Him. While I have quiet time with God, I realised that I haven’t always let myself be still and know Him (Psalm 46:10), wait upon Him, and truly listen.

Given all our work and commitments, it may not be feasible to have long undisturbed time and solitude with the Lord daily. However, I strongly encourage all of us to occasionally carve out unhurried, simple and personal retreat time, perhaps once a month. Put aside distractions like your phone and devote this time and solitude to worship, reading the Word, meditating on the truth, and listening to His voice. It doesn’t have to be long—you can start with 30 minutes or any duration that you’re comfortable with, setting it as a personal faith goal.

Trust me, the time given to the Lord will be rewarding and never in vain.

The journey to Melaka, which took between four and five hours, was without any issues. We thank God for the safe and relaxing ride, which allowed us to arrive in good spirits for the activities ahead.

Upon arrival, we were greeted with a seamless check-in process at the Courtyard by Marriott Melaka hotel. The organising committee had everything planned, from room assignment to the distribution of welcome packs, ensuring that everyone settled in without any hassle. We also had time to check out the hotel's facilities and nearby amenities before dinner.

Our meals throughout the four days of the camp were a delightful fusion of local specialties and Singaporean preferences. The food was thoughtfully adapted, allowing everyone to enjoy the rich and delicious local flavours while still being reminded of the familiar tastes of home.

The first evening in Melaka saw Pastor Benny Ho share about God's unconditional, unfailing, and unending love, and the importance of cultivating a deep and abiding love for God as the basis for loving others. Over the following three plenary sessions, Pastor Benny continued to deliver messages that were both insightful and challenging.

His messages about (i) the church as a united, loving, caring, and forgiving family, (ii) being a signpost for Christ, and (iii) keeping the fire for God burning challenged us to reflect on our faith, leaving a lasting impact on everyone who attended. One topic that inspired me was offering to pray for others, especially non-believers, as a means of outreach. As Pastor Benny shared, few would reject an offer of prayer and blessing that is presented in love.

The church camp also had inter-generational games to connect people from different age groups who might not have known each other as they attend different church services. Simple activities like flipping a plastic bottle and bouncing a ping pong ball into an egg tray created a space for bonding. Especially interesting was a game of charades where campers had to guess words from different eras. Everyone cheered and cooperated, creating a beautiful display of unity.

The free time on Sunday afternoon was an opportunity to explore Melaka's famous tourist spots. Excited campers went to visit historical sites and explore local culture, with many drawn to the delicious street food of Jonker Street.

After a final breakfast on Monday morning, we spent our last moments at the camp reflecting on the weekend's journey. With our bags packed and spirits renewed, we boarded the bus for our return trip to Singapore. The ride home felt different; it was filled with a quiet gratitude for the time spent together and the impactful lessons we had learned. Though the camp had ended, the bonds of fellowship and the spiritual growth we experienced would continue with us long after we arrived back home.

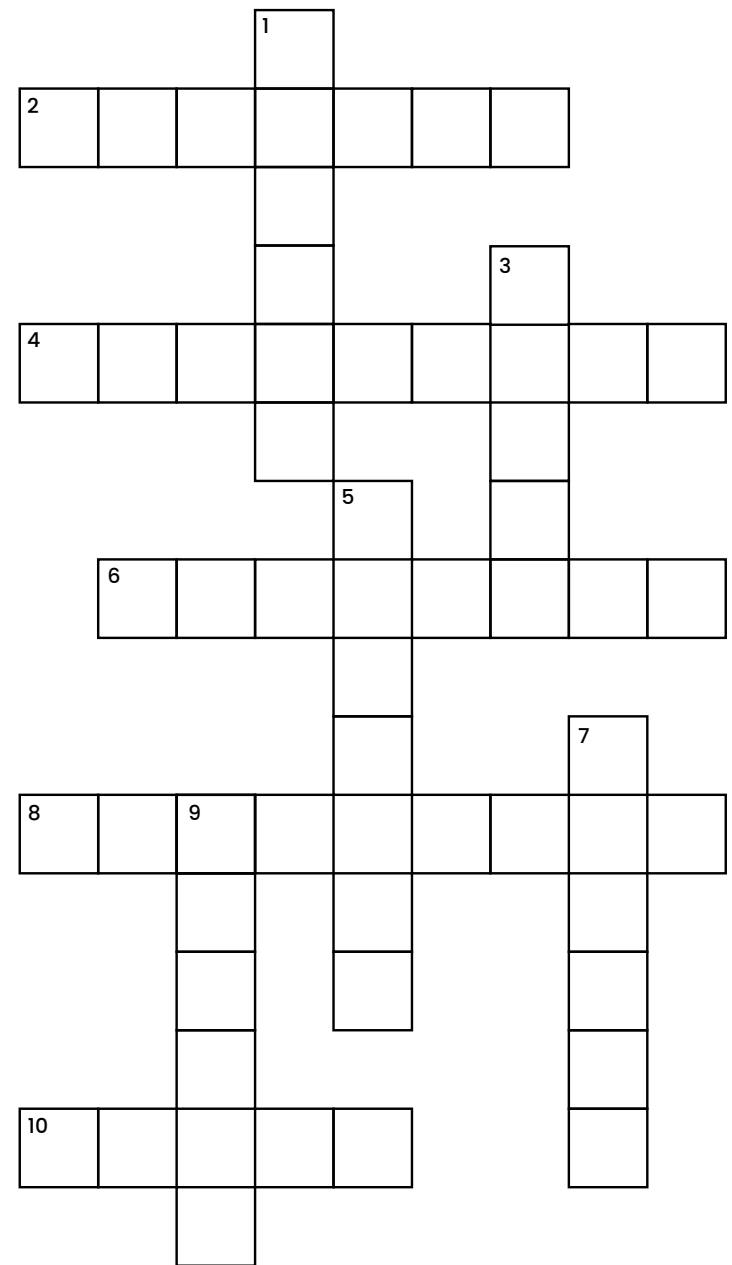

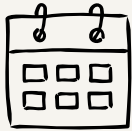
